



Quadriga takes on repeated vandalism on war memorial

The local landmark on the main road in Moulton, Cheshire, is a valued piece of history recording the lives of the Moulton men who paid the ultimate sacrifice during two world wars.

Led by Moulton Parish Council, the repair of the historic figure was commissioned yet again.

For a second time in March of this year, Quadriga, the refurbishment and restoration specialist based in Northwich, Cheshire, was commissioned to repair and renew sections of the figure. Extensive restoration work was needed on the arm and on the gun of the soldier, this involved drilling and inserting 6mm diameter stainless steel dowels which were set in epoxy resin well into the fractures. Once the arm and the gun had been recreated then all evidence of the repair work was painstakingly reinstated to match the existing surrounding stonework.

The skills of the Quadriga specialists were deployed on all aspects of the statue, each step of the process undertaken with painstaking accuracy and attention to detail including cutting back decayed or otherwise defective areas of stonework on the main damaged stone block where the names of the men who lost their lives are engraved.

All the vandalised areas of the statue's stonework were progressively restored using lightweight polymer repair mortar and finished with a wooden float to the original profile.

The Parish Council funded the restoration project and sincerely hope that it will be respected in the future.
