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Quadriga have been awarded the contract for the stone restoration work at Vincent Square, Westminster

The contract is worth over £1million and is centred around converting a historic police station and magistrates court into apartments. Located on Vincent Square and overlooking the playing fields of Westminster School, the development consists of 49 one, two and three bed apartments and duplexes as well as 21 affordable units.

The Grade II listed buildings housing the former police station and magistrates courts will be rebuilt and fully refurbished behind retained Edwardian facades and a completely new structure built in between them.

The crimes of Jack the Ripper were investigated at the old Rochester Row police station and it was also here that the Suffragettes were ordered to keep the peace in 1906.

The new buildings will consist of post-tensioned concrete frames with external envelopes of natural and reconstituted stone and brickwork with various roof finishes. Features like the stone finials will have to be specially crafted by stonemasons to be in keeping with the architectural style of a century ago.
